# **Running Wild: The Crazy Legs Race Series**



# A Life of Service Say Hello to Walter and Rima Binder

he Binder family's story is a witness to the enduring power of love, education, and community service-a legacy that continues to unfold with each passing chapter. Rima Kasubaite Binder was born in Lithuania and made her way to the U.S. where she met her husband Walter (Walt) at the University of Illinois Chicago (when it was still at Navy Pier.). Their love story unfolded over four years, a period marked by Walt's Army service.

They made their union official in 1962 in Chicago at the Nativity Blessed Virgin Mary Church in Chicago's Marquette Park community. "The church was designed and built by Lithuanian architect, Jonas Mulokas, with my uncle Vytautas Kasuba, a sculptor, designing the outdoor Madonna plaques," Rima explains. "The church remains one of our favorites. We were married there, our children were baptized there, our son was married in that church, and our grandchildren were baptized there."

The Binders are proud parents to two adult children and they have seven grandchildren. Their daughter Kristine is a teacher at a Chicago charter school with adult children of her own. She has three daughters in Chicago, all working in the city or studying higher education, a son who is an influencer in the wedding cosmetics industry, and a stepdaughter from a previous marriage. Rima and Walt's son, W. Anthony, is married to his wife Mary. Together they adopted two Lithuanian boys, now 14 and 16 years old.


